


WHY SHARE?



Our world is broken and it needs a message of hope, power, and freedom. - 2 TIM0THY 3:1-5

HOW TO SHARE THE GOSPEL?

BEFORE WE SHARE:

1 Accept the Challenge to Share.

Commit to the mission. Make disciples. Making disciples begins by sharing the Gospel.

2 Pray.

Talk to God about them (family, coworker, friend), before we talk to them about our God.

3 Identify.

Identify those with whom you'd share your faith story. Think of ways to build authentic relationships with them.

A Be You & Be Open.

Reflect on your personal faith story. Share based on your personality style*. Plant the seed. Be open to rejection.

HOW TO SHARE THE GOSPEL?

ASK. ADMIRE. ADMIT.

This is not a presentation, it should be a conversation. When sharing the Gospel, first -

ASK great questions.

"My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry..." - JAMES 1:19

Asking questions does three powerful things:

- » Breaks down cultural/relational barriers.
- » Helps you understand others' stories.
- Sives you time to pray and ask God for wisdom to turn the conversation toward spiritual things. Jesus asked engaging questions!

GOSPEL-SHARING Styles

DIRECT

Assertive to the point; "Doers and Goers!"; In the face!

INTELLECTUAL

Inquisitive (questioning); analytical logical; uses questions to start convo

TESTIMONIAL

Clear communicator and compelling story teller; relate their experience to the life of the listener

INTERPERSONAL

Conversational; focusing on needs of others and demonstrating warmth in relationships

INVITATIONAL

Relational hospitable persuasive; serving other centered work behind scenes





HOW TO SHARE THE GOSPEL?

ASK. ADMIRE. ADMIT.

ASK great questions - con't.

Starter Questions or Life Questions: "Where do you go to school?" "Do you play any sports?" "How are things going for you?" "Any good BBQ in the area?" Gospel Transition Questions: "What brings your life the most meaning?" "Do you go to church anywhere?" "Do you have any spiritual beliefs?" "Has anyone ever told you about purpose?"



ADMIRE what you can about what they believe.

"Paul then stood up in the meeting of the Areopagus and said: "People of Athens! I see that in every way you are very religious." - ACTS 17:22

Build bridges, not walls. You can find something to admire in every belief system and about every person.

Ex: "I really admire that about you." "Your desire to know what religion is really right." "I really admire your passion." "I admire your honesty and vulnerability with me."



ADMIT why you believe in Jesus.

"Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners - of whom I am the worst." -1 TIMOTHY 1:15

» Ex: "I'm someone that makes mistakes...I miss the mark too."

Say "Do you have a story like that? Would you like to? Cool, let me share God's story." - See "What is the Gospel" on pg. 1.







HOW TO SHARE THE GOSPEL? LAND THE PLANE



Ask "does that make sense?" If not, ask what parts. If yes, continue to the second question.

- 2 Ask "is there anything right now keeping you from putting your trust in Jesus?" If not, pray with them (prayer doesn't save them, it's just a good "wrap up and way to celebrate the decision they have just made"). If yes, thank them for being open to a conversation. Ask them if they would be fine with exchanging numbers to say connected. (don't be discouraged if they aren't receptive, you've planted a seed for the Holy Spirit to work!)
- Get them connected to a loving bible-centered church. 3 **Until they find a church...you can be their accountability circle.
